

Private Daniel Newingham

Birth: 1752 Ireland

Death: Ante August 19, 1794 York, York County, PA

Daniel Newingham left his home in England and went to Ireland, where he married Hannah. He subsequently emigrated to America, about 1774 or 1775, settling in York, PA, where his sons, Henry and David were born.

During the Revolutionary War, he enlisted with Carberry's Company on April 30, 1777, and served as a Private under General Wayne at battles of Brandywine, Paoli and Germantown. They spent the winter at the Valley Forge encampment. Early in 1778, Washington sent the troops from York to guard the Continental Congress, who had fled Philadelphia after the British invaded. Daniel served in the "New" 11th Regiment which was later combined into the 3rd Regiment. It is believed David died in the war, although the exact place and date are not known.
